China Customs Advance Manifest (CCAM) Regulation Update

Dear Customer,

The parallel run of the old manifest process in China and the new China Customs Advance Manifest (CCAM) process continues.

As earlier advised, China Customs expects to receive a manifest from carriers in adherence to both the old and new processes during the parallel run period and clearance decisions of China Customs are being made in accordance with the manifest submitted under the old process. However, carriers do face the possibility of being fined for failure to submit in accordance with the CCAM process as well. Furthermore, submission of the advance manifest in accordance with the new process allows us to ensure we, as Maersk Line, along with our customers, are prepared for the full enforcement of CCAM, which is expected to be no later than the 1st of January 2010.

Although the loading process for vessels departing from or bound for Mainland China ports will continue as it is today during the parallel run period, it is strongly recommended that all shippers submit complete and correct shipping instructions (SI) prior to the SI cut-off. If in case you need more information regarding your local SI cut-offs, please contact your local Maersk Line representative. As soon as China Customs cuts over to fully enforcing the new CCAM regulation, we will only load cargo for which shipping instructions have been received in due time for transmission of the advance manifest no later than 24 hours prior to loading vessels departing from or bound for Mainland China.
