ECS Surcharge Update on E3W & E4W Services

Dear Valued Customer,

As part of our ongoing commitment to supply chain transparency and service excellence, Maersk continuously monitors global market developments to maintain the stability of our ocean networks.

Following a recent review of current market conditions, we are announcing an increase in the Emergency Contingency Surcharge (ECS) for all shipments on E3W and E4W routes originating from the Indian Subcontinent, effective 1st July 2026.

The new tariff levels are as follows:
